


This fresh water spring gushes from the rear of a cave and has served as a pilgrimage site for religious devotees since ancient times. The water is believed to cure a wide variety of diseases and is recognized by the Ministry of Environment as one of the nation's 100 most prominent bodies of water. The cave is located in a mountain valley and is accessed via a pathway that is surrounded by trees and lined by more than 200 stone Buddha statues, leaving visitors with the feeling that they have entered another world. **23** 076-472-4711




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

2 Oiwa-san Nissekiji Temple

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The head temple of Shingon Buddhism, an esoteric sect that is said to have begun practice in the year 725. The Buddhist rock carvings within the temple grounds were chiseled by workspiers and have been recognized as national historical monuments and important cultural properties. In particular, the rock carving of Fudo Myo-o, standing more than three meters tall, has been praised for its size, beauty and preservation as one of the most outstanding examples of its kind in all of Japan. As such, the temple is a frequent pilgrimage site for worshipers from all over the nation. **2 076-472-2301**










7 Mt. Hageyama Hiking Trail (464.7m)

14 Yuminosato Hall of Cultural History



A place where visitors can learn about medicinal plants, this facility is symbolic of Toyama Prefecture's reputation as the capital of Japanese pharmaceutics. In May, Chinese and Mountain peonies reach full bloom, while in November, Chinese Quinces take on their golden hue.

13 Banbajima

As the foothold of Mt. Tsurugidake, Banbajima is visited regularly by mountain climbers. It is surrounded by the lush nature of Chübu-Sangaku National Park and home to accommodations such as Banbajima Lodge. The area is located between the Tateyama and Shirahagi rivers, the waters of which provide visitors with tranquil "background music"

Access the trail by crossing the bridge at the rear of the Oiwa bus stop plaza. There is no pass at the summit where the Myogadaniyama Mountain Castle Ruins are located, but you will find a 360 degree panoramic view of beautiful natural scenery throughout all four seasons.

8 Mt. Jogadaira Hiking Trails(446.5m)



Can be accessed from the center of Furusato Tsurugi Shin Shizen Natural Park, which is located atop the No.2 Kamiichi River Dam. Fron the pass, you can see the waters of the Hayatsuki River and a panoramic view of Mt. Tsurugidake.

9 Mt. Sengokujoyama Hiking Trails(757.6m)



The entrance to the path is located in front of the Banbajima bridge. At the trail's peak, you will find a stunning direct view of Mt. Tsurugidake in all its glory, along with Mt. Yakushidake to the south and Mt. Kekachi to the north.

10 Mt. Nakayama Hiking Trails(1,255.2m)



"Zen" at Sakka Temple

As a prominent temple in the Soto School of Buddhism, Ganmokuzan Ryusenji Temple hold morning meditation sessions on the first Sunday of each month, as well as full day experiences, including a whole day spent doing Zazen meditation copying sutra, and assisting with daily temple chores. In addition, they also offer a "Zen Wedding" ceremony that follows traditional Zen precepts. For those that take part, it will surely be a memorable event that will strengthen the bonds of any marriage.



Collectively, the Sakka, Oiwa, and Banbajima areas have been recognized for their natural scenery and historical culture as "Tsurugidake irameki no Mori." one of the nation's rare orest therapy" sites (officially designated in 2012). Forest Therapy Sessions

Yuminosho Castle Ruins Located next to present-day Yuminosato Hall of Cultural History. It served as a residence for members of the Doi Clan, who once ruled the Nakaniikawa region.

A mountain castle located atop Mt. Sengokujoyama. It was the major mountain castle of the Horie branch of the Doi clan.

Inamura Castle Ruins Located on a mountain summit that overlooks the north end of the Kamiichi River Dam. The Lord of the castle is said to

zadanivama Mountain Castle Ruins mountain castle that was located atop Mt. gadaira. It was an outer citadel used by the minosho branch of the Doi Clan. The flatnes ountain's peak is a remnant of its past use.

Gomado Castle Ruins Near the border between Kamiichi Town and Namerikawa City, it was the castle located at the mountain's summit. The lords of the castle were the Minowa clan.

Kakizawa Castle Ruins Located atop the right bank of the Oiwa River as it nears the plains. It was the residence of the Yuminosho branch of the Doi clan.
